

Clear spacing between cable tray layers



Overview

When installing two cable trays in parallel at the same height, the distance between them should be no less than 0. This spacing is crucial for adequate maintenance access, ease of inspection, and ensuring proper airflow for effective heat dissipation. The spacing between trays, whether horizontal or vertical, depends on various factors like cable type, environment, and tray material. Proper installation can significantly reduce. The International Electrotechnical Commission (IEC) provides detailed guidelines for cable tray systems under IEC 61537. A rung spacing of 6 to 9 inches (150 to 230 mm) is preferable when the cable tray is used for instrumentation and control applications that require. Below are the key principles to guide the layout of E&I cable trays, focusing on practical, safety, and efficiency aspects.
