

Should ladder-type cable trays be covered



Overview

Ladder cable tray without covers provides for maximum air flow, dissipating heat produced in current carrying conductors. Dust buildup is minimal compared to other types of cable tray, such as ventilated trough or solid bottom. In areas where there is the potential for dust to accumulate, ladder.
