

Which end of the pigtail should be tested



Overview

Connect one multimeter lead to one end of the pigtail and the other lead to the other end. This test verifies whether there is an unbroken electrical path through the wire. So, what exactly is a pigtail connector?

Let's find out! There are two reasons we may want to test bare fiber, by that we mean fiber that has not been terminated in connectors but is simply plain optical fiber. The first one is to ensure the fiber or cable being manufactured meets its specifications, as is done by every manufacturer. Locate the correct circuit using a voltage tester or labeled directory. "Double-check with a non-contact voltage detector – live wires can kill even experienced professionals," advises a licensed contractor with OSHA. A proper connection should pass a gentle "pull test," where each wire is tugged individually to confirm it is locked securely within the connector.
